THE KIMS Bahrain Medical Centre (KBMC) yesterday became the first of its kind in the GCC to receive an international healthcare accreditation from Australia.

"With the completion of the ACSHI accreditation process, KBMC has developed a firm system of patient care based on infection control and safety," said Mr Johnston. "It has also helped in creating a culture of evidence-based approach to healthcare and data-driven decision-making.

"Thus KBMC has taken the right step in upholding their vision of providing quality health care at an affordable cost."

Opened in June 2004, KBMC, is a multi-speciality medical centre offering outpatient and diagnostic services, from Umm Al Hassam.
