Bahrain sale begins

MANAMA: The general sale begins today with 545 participating shops. The sale runs until June 15, says Bahrain Chamber of Commerce and Industry first assistant secretary general Mohiydeen Bahlool, and stores can extend it by a further week. Shop sale advertisements are required to indicate the sale permit number. A chamber team will be visiting the market to ensure that there are no regulation violations. Traders must offer a minimum reduction of 20 per cent on goods except foodstuffs for which the discount must be not less than 10pc. Goods subject to sale should also carry the actual price of the product.

NEW DELHI: At least 16 people, including four children, were killed and more than 100 injured yesterday in a blaze that swept through a crowded area in the old quarters of the Indian capital, a news report said.

BEI GRADE: Nato missiles hit a sanatori-BELGRADE: Nato missites hit a sanatorium and an apartment building in southern Serbia yesterday, killing at least 27 people and taking the civilian toll to over 50 in two days, Yugoslav media said.
