Industry looks ahead

Gulf 'geared up for future technology'

BAHRAIN'S industry should look ahead with confidence and optimism at the challenges it faces in the next decade.

This was the message put out by Oil and Industry Minister Shaikh Isa bin Ali Al Khalifa at the opening yesterday of the second Middle East Geosciences Exhibition and Conference (GEO '96) at the Bahrain International Exhibition Centre.

He said the oil and gas industry in the Gulf was fully manned and driven by skilful and creative professionals.

"It has all the needs to sustain its record of outstanding leadership well into the next decade," Shaikh Isa said in an address to visitors at opening.

Shaikh Isa said he was confident that whatever breakthroughs occurred in the industry worldwide, they

"GEO '96 is a venue for industry leaders, as well as for some of the latest survey and technical equipment for oil and gas exploration," said Arabian Exhibition Management visitor promotions officer Heidi Rohm.

She said 108 lectures and 54 poster reports are being presented during the conference.

The event has been endorsed by the American Association of Petroleum Geologists, the Dhahran Geological Society, the Society of Explorationists in the Emirates, the Canadian Society for Exploration Geophysicists and Gulf Academia. The exhibition sponsored by Bahrain's Oil and Industry Ministry is open from 9am to 6pm today and tomorrow.

The conference is coordinated by Bahrain National Oil Company (Banoco).

Speakers are scheduled in four segments during exhibition hours.

Exhibition admission is free to industry professionals.
